As a student in an OhioLINK member institution, you have access through your campus library to immediately available online articles, books, and streaming media, as well as print books and other materials from around the state. Using library resources can feel confusing at first, but with a little practice, they are a convenient way to find fast, free, and creditable information. And librarians want to help you find what you need!



As Ohio's academic library consortium, OhioLINK provides your campus library with a vast array of scholarly resources—both print and online. Thanks to OhioLINK member libraries' shared library catalog, faculty and students also have access to millions of books and other kinds of printed materials such as maps, music scores, and AV materials, e-books, journals, articles, and streaming video, too.

Students at Ohio two- and fouryear colleges have access to high-quality scholarly content through OhioLINK—no matter the institution's size or geography.

Start at your campus library

It's always best to start your search with your own library—either online or in-person—because your library has resources beyond OhioLINK's. Talk with your library in advance of an assignment deadline to make sure that you can authenticate and know how to search for what you might need. Your librarians would be excited to assist you in using the library's electronic or print resources.

24/7 access to online, citable journal articles, e-books, and streaming video

Online access makes it easy to find credible, relevant information about topics for assignments and research papers—at any time, day or night. Discover OhioLINK's vast collection of e-resources—from electronic books and academic journals to music, maps and periodicals, and streaming video.

Books from libraries across Ohio

Students have access to so much more than what is available at the campus library. Request books and other kinds of printed materials through the library's catalog. Choose among more than 38 million items that typically arrive at your library within 3–5 business days. Ohio college students can even borrow books and videos from SearchOhio public libraries. Ask your campus library for more information.

No-cost-to-student course materials

You may be able to avoid paying for textbooks or other required readings by borrowing them through OhioLINK. OhioLINK books can be checked out for three weeks and renewed up to six times—if no other requests are placed on the book(s). Online journal articles can be located through your library's website

Free online tutoring

OhioLINK eTutoring offers free online tutoring and writing reviews for College Credit Plus and undergraduate students at 20 participating higher education institutions. eTutoring has helped more than 30,000 students since 2010.

Off-campus access

- You may be prompted to authenticate using your campus ID information.
- Contact your library if you do not know how to authenticate or are having problems logging into resources.

Advanced search options

- Make searches more specific and effective by taking advantage of filters and search options.
- Your librarian can help you with search strategies and assist in selecting which resources to use.

Renew online

- You can renew OhioLINK materials via your library's website.
- OhioLINK material overdue fines may be different from your campus library's so be sure to return on time. Check with your library.
